Wilmot Proviso, 1846.

(Offered as an amendment to an appropriations bill to finance territorial negotiations with Mexico during the Mexican War). Passed in the House of Representatives, but never in the Senate.

Provided, That, as an express and fundamental condition to the acquisition of any territory from the Republic of Mexico by the United States, by virtue of any treaty which may be negotiated between them, and to the use by the Executive of the moneys herein appropriated, neither slavery nor involuntary servitude shall ever exist in any part of said territory, except for crime, whereof the party shall first be duly convicted
